



The Day Scholar Settlement: Am I Eligible and Which Claim Form Do I Use?

Day Scholar is someone who attended an Indian Residential School during the day but did not sleep there at night.

Are you a Day Scholar who attended an Indian Residential School during the day but did not sleep there at night?*

If YES, please fill out a **Survivor Claim Form**.

Do you wish to apply on behalf of a Day Scholar who **died on or after May 30, 2005**?*

If YES, please continue to question 3.

Note: Day Scholars who died before May 30, 2005, are not eligible for this settlement.

Is there an executor/administrator/trustee/liquidator for the deceased Day Scholar's estate? (Someone appointed to look after the deceased's estate, generally either named in the will or appointed by the court.)

If YES, the estate executor, administrator, trustee or liquidator is responsible for filling out an **Estate Claim Form**.

If NO, please continue to question 4.

Are you related to the deceased?

If YES, please continue.

If NO, you are **NOT ELIGIBLE** to submit a claim form, unless you are the executor, administrator, trustee or liquidator.

If YES, before continuing, you will need to determine who is the highest priority living heir. Go down the list below and identify the first living person on the list – that person is the highest priority heir:
