



The Day Scholars Settlement:

I attended a Federal Indian Residential School, am I eligible?

Are you a Day Scholar – someone who attended a Federally run Indian Residential School during the day but did not sleep there overnight?

If **yes**, please continue to Question 2 If **no**, you are not eligible to submit a claim for this settlement

2

Is the school you attended on the Schedule E list of Indian Residential Schools?

If **yes**, please continue to Question 3

If **no**, this could mean a couple things.

- It could mean your school was actually a Federal Indian Day School, not a Federal Indian Residential School. Students who attended a Federal Indian Day School may be eligible for compensation through the Federal Indian Day School Class Action Settlement. - It could mean your school was not a Federal Indian Residential School that was set up and funded by the Canadian Government, and you are not eligible for this settlement.

Did you attend the Federal Indian Residential School between the opening date and the school closing/ transfer date stated on the Schedule E list?

If **yes**, you may be eligible for this settlement and can fill out a claim form. Visit www.dayscholarsclaims.com for more information on completing a claim form.

If **no**, you are not eligible for this settlement. This means you may have attended during a time when the school was no longer being operated as a Federal Indian Residential School.
